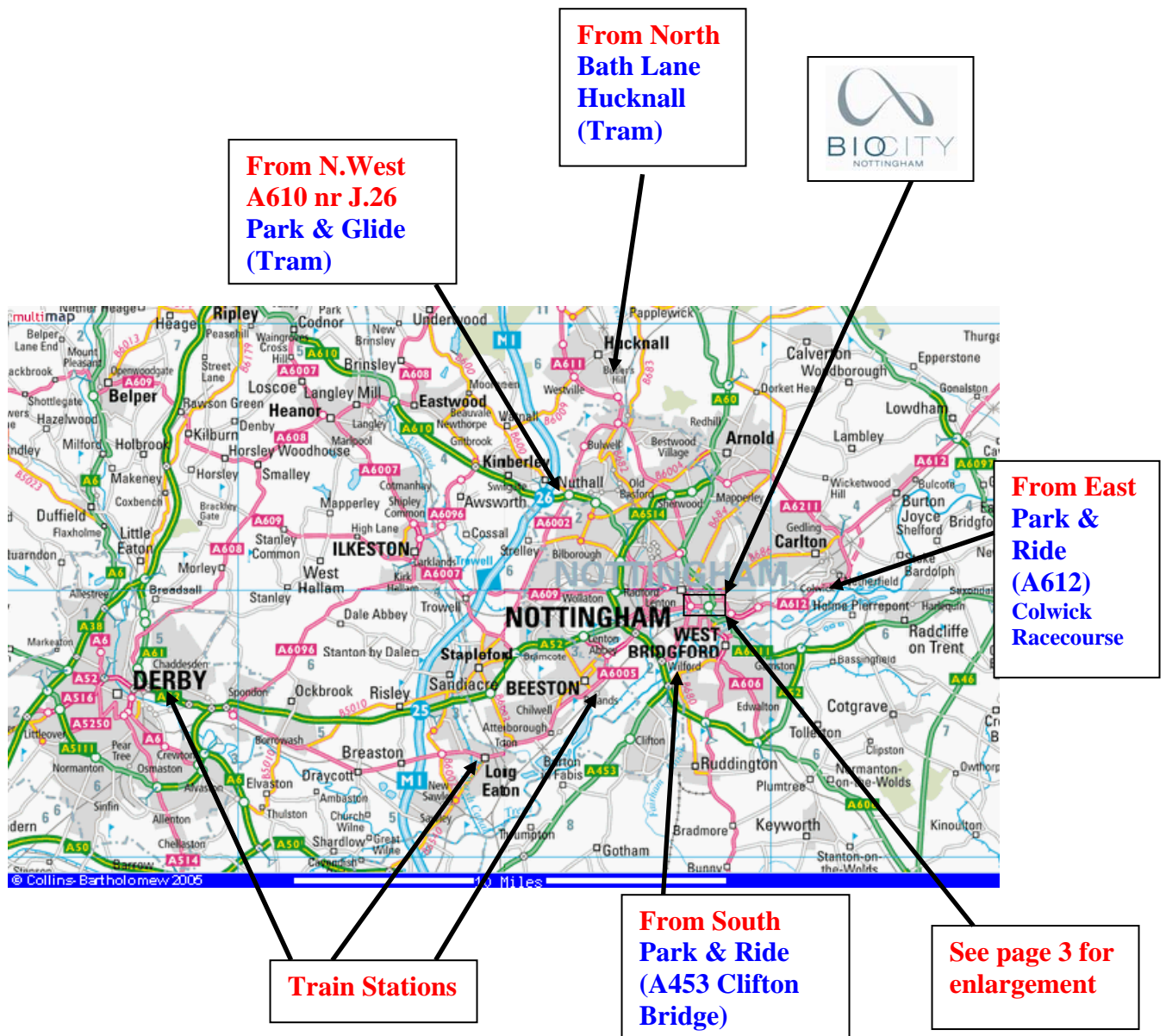




There are lots of alternative ways of travelling to BioCity which can be easier than driving. The following sheets will provide useful information on the routes in to help you make the journey.



PARK & RIDE (BUS)

From South of Nottingham (A453)

This service, **Link 1**, runs every 10 minutes and is situated on Queen's Drive near Clifton Bridge. It goes to Broadmarsh, Victoria Centre and Market Square. The first bus to the city is 06.05 and the last bus back to Queens Drive is 19.00. £2.50 return for a single person, £4.00 for up to 6 people and £2.70 for a **Kangaroo ticket** which allows unlimited travel on all trams and buses within City limits (correct as at May '06). From East of Nottingham (A612)

This service, **Link 2**, runs every 10 minutes and is situated at Colwick Racecourse. It stops very close to BioCity on Eldon Street (just off Manvers Street). The first bus is at 07.05 and last bus back is 19.05. £2.50 return for a single person, £3.50 for up to 6 people and £2.70 for a **Kangaroo ticket** which allows unlimited travel on all trams and buses within City limits (correct as at May '06). PARK & GLIDE (TRAM)

The nearest tram stops are both about a 5 minute walk from BioCity on Station Street at the railway station or Fletcher Gate (just through The Lace Market). Full tram location maps can be viewed on www.itsnottingham.info.

*You can also purchase a **City Rider** ticket which allows **all day travel on trams and Nottingham City Transport** for a cost of £2.50.*

From West of Nottingham (A610)

Situated at the Pheonix Centre on the A610 near M1 J.26. It travels through Cinderhill, Highbury Vale, Basford and into the City to The Royal Centre, Old Market Square, Lace Market and Station Street. The first tram runs at 05.58 and the last one back to the site is at 00.10

From North of Nottingham

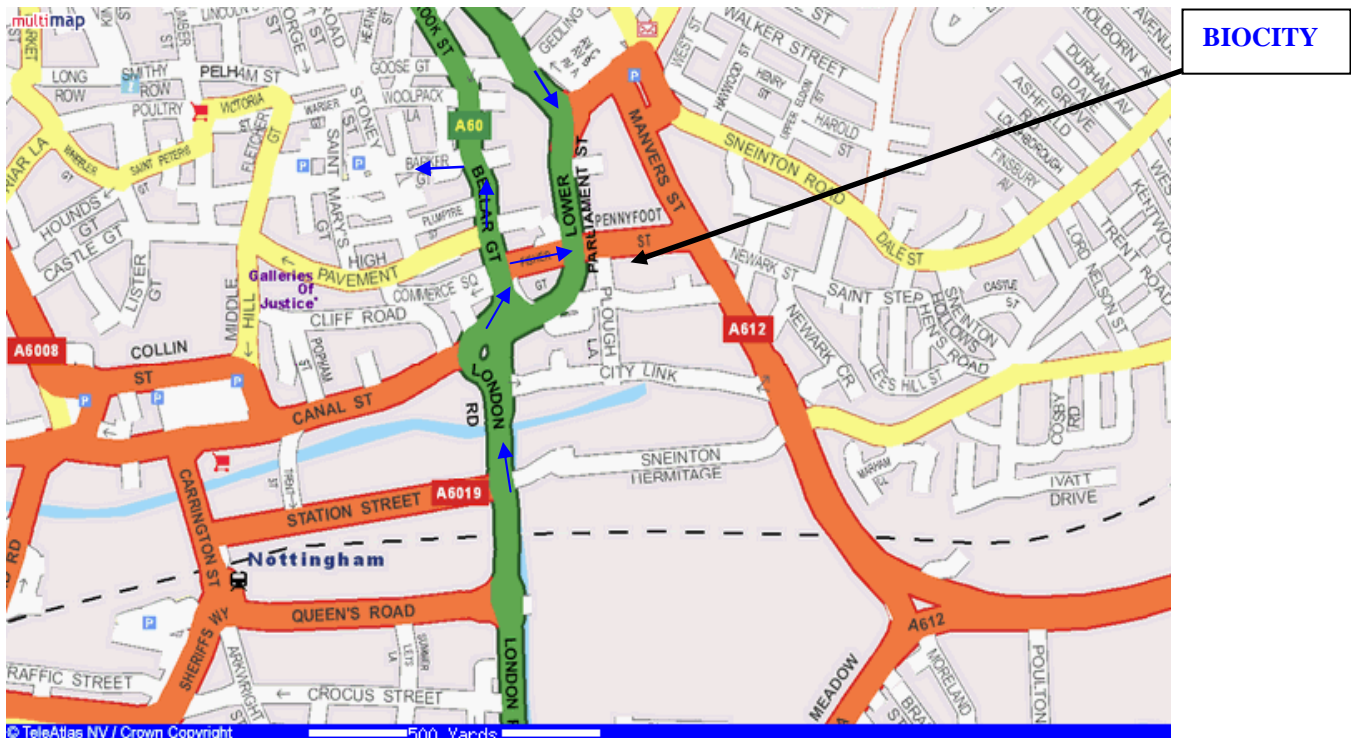
There are two services from the North, as follows.

Bath Lane, Hucknall. Runs through Old Market Square, Lace Market and Station Street. The first tram is at 06.02 and the last one is at midnight.

The Forest (Goose Fair site) between the A610 and A60. Trams run every 5/6 minutes, the first tram runs at 05.46 and the last one back to the site is at 00.10.

DRIVING TO BIOCITY AND LOCAL OFF-SITE CAR PARKING

There are several car parks near Pennyfoot Street, one of the nearest being the NCP on Stoney Street which is about a 5 minute walk away. There are also car parks at Fletcher Gate, the Metro on Huntingdon Street, Broadmarsh and Victoria Centres, plus limited metered parking with a maximum stay time of 2 hrs. There is also a very small surface car park (**only 45 spaces**) at Sneinton Square, but not every day. Note also that the parking on Manvers Street is metered (2 hrs). www.itstnottingham.info has full location maps for all car parks.
